

Help stop military compensation being counted as income

Poppy Appeal fundraisers worked with local schools and the wider community to create a poppy gallery and window installation at their local John Lewis store in Leicester.

Customers, staff and the local community knitted poppies to create a Poppy dress, while children from local schools and charities contributed Poppy inspired artworks. 2,705 handmade poppies were created and they raised £3440.73 for the Poppy Appeal.

Veterans are having their military compensation counted as income when assessed for means-tested benefits which undermines the [Armed Forces Covenant](#). Under this system, veterans and their families who are struggling, who've received compensation for injury, illness, or losing a loved one, are pushed beyond the threshold for Pension Credit. This means they miss out on thousands of pounds in support. Our Credit Their Service campaign aims to end this injustice. Please write to your MP and urge them to support our campaign. Justice for LGBT veterans

The Parliamentary debate on [Lord Etherton's review](#) into the treatment of LGBT veterans marked a historic moment for those affected by the pre-2000 'gay ban'. The Government announced a [£75 million LGBT Financial Recognition Scheme](#), offering up to £70,000 for veterans harmed by the ban.
