Get ready for Annual Conference

Just days away from Annual Conference 2024, we look forward to welcoming delegates and visitors both in-person and remotely. Here is a roundup of what you need to know.

Parade registration and wristbands

Online parade registration has now closed. If you have not registered but wish to participate in the parade, it is essential you register in advance at the Memorabilia/Help stand in the exhibition. Those who have registered can collect their wristband from the Memorabilia/Help stand. Wristbands will be required to join the parade on Sunday.

Saturday evening entertainment and meal

For evening entertainment, we have a line-up of music and comedy starting at 6.30pm. For those who would like to enjoy a meal on site so they can catch the show, catering will open in the main hall from 5pm. Please note, meals should be pre-ordered [using this link](#). Choices include roast beef, chicken supreme or a nut roast, along with an assortment of side dishes. A pop-up bar will also be open in the main hall.

National Parade Marshal appointment

Norman will shadow our current NPM for 12 months where he will then be charged and assume office at the conclusion of our Annual Conference in Harrogate, May 2025 when the current NPMs term of office concludes.

The post of Deputy NPM will be advertised in the near future. It is the Ceremonial Working Group's intent that interviews will be conducted prior to Annual Conference 2024. Congratulations to Norman and we all look forward to working with you in the future.

Remembering the Service and Sacrifice of the Generation of 1944

2024 sees the 80th anniversaries of momentous turning points of the Second World War. To help you mark these in your communities we have produced free-standing exhibition units that mark the important anniversaries of 2024. Available to order are a four-sided tower, one- and two-sided pull up banners and a large poster.

For 2024, you can order the following display units:

- Exploring D-Day and the Battle of Normandy.
- Exploring the 80th anniversaries of 1944 including D-Day and the Battle of Normandy, Monte Cassino, Kohima, Imphal, Operation Market Garden and the Battle of the Scheldt.

Remembering Kosovo – 25 years on

This June we will mark the 25th anniversary of the end of the war in Kosovo and the deployment of the NATO-led international peacekeeping Kosovo Force (KFOR).

Diversity and Inclusion Survey

In January 2022 we surveyed Branch Chairs to find out how confident they were engaging with more diverse communities in their area and what support they needed to do this. We received a huge range of responses and are now repeating the survey to enable us to assess the impact of our Diversity and Inclusion Action Plan and develop our new strategy.

Barrier for non-UK Armed Forces families removed

Our [2024 General Election manifesto](#) urged the Government to abolish the Minimum Income Requirement for personnel to bring family members born outside of the UK to the country they serve. In March, the Government responded to our calls, and announced that for serving personnel who want to bring their families to the UK, it would bring the minimum income requirement down to £23,496, which is the minimum Armed Forces salary. We are delighted with this win!

Families are essential support networks for anyone who serves. RBL and Poppyscotland believe that making it impossible for personnel to spend their evenings and weekends with their spouses, partners and children undermines their service to the UK and contradicts the Armed Forces covenant.

We are delighted that the Government will bring the income requirement for those who serve to the minimum Armed Forces salary, allowing family members to join serving personnel in the UK without barriers. Read our full statement [here](#).

Good practice

Fivemiletown, County Tyrone

Fivemiletown Royal British Legion Branch and Club in Northern Ireland was delighted to receive the Kings Award for Voluntary Service from His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for County Tyrone Mr Robert Scott OBE on 20th April 2024. Equivalent to an MBE, the award is only presented after a rigorous selection process.

Fivemiletown RBL is a small rural Branch/Club with 200 members who are truly embedded into the fabric of their community. They recently received a National Award from RBL for their work in the community during the COVID 19 pandemic. In recent years they raised over £35,000 to build a community war memorial and a book called "Fivemiletown's Fallen" which tells the story behind the 73 names on the memorial.

Club Chairman Iain Lendrum BEM stated "While we maintain RBL's core values of acting as the lead for Remembrance and veterans' welfare we strive to be so much more in the local community. Our success is based on strong links between our Branch, Club, Members, and our local community."

The presentation was attended by over 100 branch/club volunteers, supporting community organisations and elected representatives. His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for County Tyrone Robert Black OBE was accompanied by his newly appointed LL Cadet Aaron Magee, Deputy LL Frances Nolan and Graham Dodds. Lord and Lady Brookeborough also attended, maintaining their close links to Fivemiletown RBL. Branch Chairman Robert Carson commented "This award is a reflection

of the hard work put in by all our volunteers and to receive the signed Certificate and Crystal from King Charles makes it even more special.”
